Facilitation of intra-Libyan dialogue



The Libyan conflict began in 2011, following the popular protest movement that led to the fall of Colonel Gaddafi. Two civil wars followed, in 2011 and 2014. Despite the efforts of the United Nations, the situation has become even more complex as internal divisions have been exacerbated by the involvement of many external actors, both from the Arab world and the West.



From May 11 to 13, 2018 in Dakar, the Foundation brought together, through its Founding Chairman, opponents from all political backgrounds to begin an intra-Libyan dialogue. It was an informal meeting, based on the "Ollivier Method", intended to create a climate of trust: work, lunch, even pray together. The preparatory work had required many months of parallel diplomatic efforts.


Participants in the intra-Libyan dialogue meet in Dakar

It is a dialogue to allow parties in conflict to meet under the same roof, to exchange, to see the major contradictions, and to see how to overcome these contradictions in order to turn to the future. This step was important because these are brothers who until now have only communicated through arms, and who today will be able to talk to each other.


